“ Frank and I were on the Jr. Rockets Football and Basketball teams. We went to Berlin to play basketball against their Base/dependent team, when Berlin was still divided by the Berlin Wall. We traveled through one of the corridors by train. It was an overnight trip and it would stop at these train stations with heavily armed East German guards, several times during the night. We didn't sleep much. We got to Berlin exhausted and ate breakfast at a chow hall there, and toured a bit. We went to Checkpoint Charlie and the museum there, and walked right up to the Wall. From our side you could put your hand on it. From the East German side you would be dead before you got that close to the wall (they didn't want you to escape from East Germany to Democracy & Capitalism). You could see the guards in their towers not very far away. Frank and I were awed by the experience. It seemed surreal.

We played the basketball game and lost heavily due to our exhausted state. Berlin was happy to avenge their previous loss to us at Rhein Main. Then Frank and I went touring some more with a couple of the Berlin players. What a tense place to live!

Frank was a great friend to me, and an inspiration. I'm glad I got to see him again at the Reunion.
