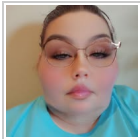

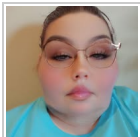

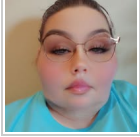

“ Christina Clark lit a candle in memory of Mrs. Betty Rayburn Everidge

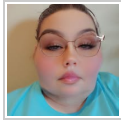

I am so sorry for your loss. I know Mrs. Everidge's health was not good and even at this age, it can be sad. She now has a new body and a clear mind and you have so many wonderful memories.

My family moved in across Lemon Street from her in 1977. We loved seeing her out in the yard and driving her classic Camaro.

At that time the festival was still two blocks away and Dad starting parking a few cars at .50. In 1991 with the Everidges needing help parking and Dad having enough help already that year, I parked for her in '91, '92. and '94 before Dad needed me. (Didn't park in '93. being almost due with my daughter.) Mrs. Everidge would say things like "I bet you're tired.", "Are you happy with what you made today?" and "You have a pretty complexion."
