Rev. Bobby Dee Hogan, 88, of Riverview, Florida, formerly of San Bernardino, California, born in Decatur, Arkansas on March 6, 1932, was lifted to Heaven on the wings of a Snow White Dove on January 24, 2021

From a young age Bobby had a relationship with the Lord and followed God's calling to surrender his life to spread the gospel and preach. He moved to Fort Worth, Texas to attend the Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. After receiving his degree he began his ministry in Texas. Throughout his career he led 5 different churches and missions in the states of Texas and Michigan and was the pastor of the Boissevain Baptist Church, and Seneca Baptist Church in Virginia; and the Brushfork Baptist Church in West Virginia. Bobby was truly a servant of God, spending his life serving the Lord. He found great joy in witnessing to everyone he met and always tried to do what was right even when it was the most difficult thing to do.

Bobby cherished his family and instilled in them a strong desire to have the faith to trust and obey the Lord God Almighty. He was a great father and grandfather, and loved spending time with his family, watching sporting events, driving grandchildren to school, family dinners, playing games, and taking vacations. He was interested in politics and world events and he really enjoyed WWII history and movies. Bobby had a unique sense of humor and loved joking. He was compassionate, giving, and was always helping those in need. He liked listening to music, singing, walking, and working outdoors.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Jackie Hogan; parents, Earl and

Juanita Hogan; and great-grandson, Harrison Barkes. He is survived by his wife, Mary Hogan; children, Janet Barkes (Roger), Julieann Ramsey (Jeff), and Brad Hogan (Donna); six grandchildren: Sundae Hneleski (Nace), Travis Barkes, Gregory Bowman (Jennifer), Jaclyn Bowman, Steven Bowman (Kate), Holly Hogan; and eight great grandchildren.

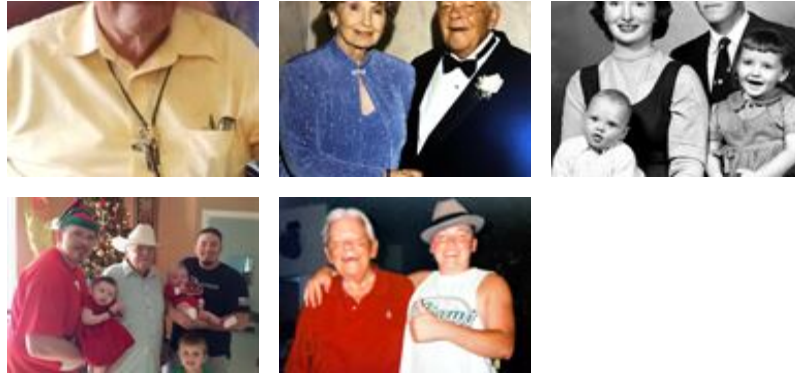
