Cindy Choquette (formerly Whitehead, née Johnson) of Plant City, Florida (formerly of Clinton, Michigan) passed away on December 9th, 2016 due to complications of throat cancer. She was 74 years old.

Cindy was born January 14th, 1942 in Detroit, Michigan the only child of Walter and Irene Johnson. She grew up in Detroit, graduating from Pershing High School in 1960.
