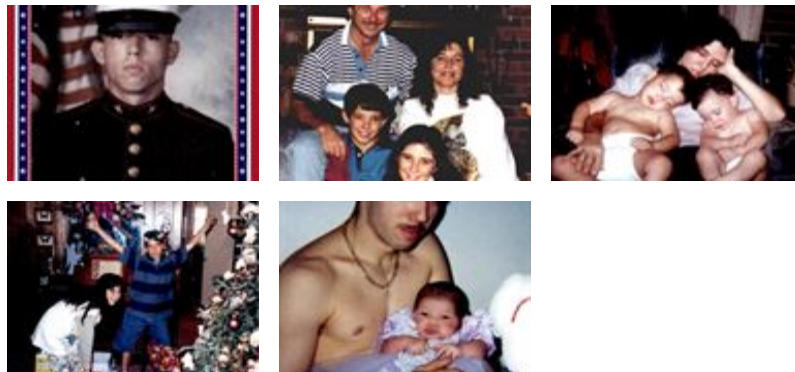
“ Next week will be a year, it's hard to believe and breaks my heart to pieces.

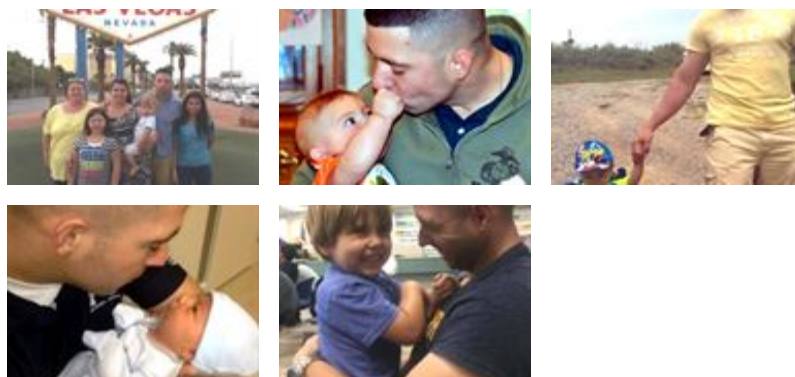
