EVANS, Donald L., 83, of Plant City, Florida, passed away on Saturday, December 5, 2009. He was born and raised in upstate New York until his family moved to Plant City when he was 14. He graduated from Plant City High School in 1944, and worked in a war production plant until he entered the U.S. Army Air Corps in 1945. After his military service, he attended the University of Florida graduating with a bachelor's and a master's degree in mathematics education. He served 39 years as a teacher at Bartow Air Base, Polk Community College, and in the Hillsborough County public school system. He was a member of Plant City's First Baptist Church and the AOPA, and was an active pilot. He is survived by his wife of 60 years Margie B.
