Rev. Ernest E. Holbrook, age 82, passed away on Friday, May 20, 2011, of heart failure. He was born on March 8, 1929 in Plant City, Florida. A retired pastor, Rev. Holbrook was also an evangelist, radio minister, and an author. He pastored more than 44 years at four different churches, and founded Faith Temple Assembly of God in Plant City, pastoring there for 27 years. His radio program, "Temple Vespers," spanned most of those years on WPLA, WCIE, and WTWB. He is survived by his wife, Junell Player Holbrook, three daughters, Sandra Waldron of Plant City, Sharon Franklin and Phyllis Conner, both of Lakeland, eight grandchildren and five great-grandchildren. Visitation will be held Thursday, May 26th, 6 – 8pm at Plant City Church of God, 2103 Mud Lake Road. The funeral will be held Friday, May 27th at 11 am, also at the church.
