LaMoyne Eloise Sutton of west of Greenville passed away on October 23 at 7:00 A.M. while staying in Seffner, Florida with her daughter and several grandchildren nearby.

She graduated from Evanston Township High School in Evanston in 1943. Then she attended St. Margaret's Hospital School of Nursing in Hammond, IN as a member of the U.S. Cadet Nurse Corps during World War II. After her marriage she moved to Greenville and worked for Dr. Wm. L. Hall in his office. Soon after Utlaut Memorial Hospital opened, she served 12 years there as a Licensed Practical Nurse working as an Operating Room Technician. Due to a back injury, she left there and went to work as a file clerk in the office at DeMoulin Brothers. She worked there for 18 years until her retirement in 1990. She was a member of the Greenville Knitters Club as well as a member of the 1st Christian Church in Greenville.

She was born July 19, 1925 in Evanston, IL to Howard Albert and Thelma Leoline Bell (Johnson) Lapp. She met her future husband Harry Junior Sutton through a nurse friend after he was shot in the back during the Pacific Theater. After the war, they married on November 24, 1945 in Evanston. They spent over 52 years together before he preceded her in death on January 10, 1998.

She is survived by 3 daughters, Mrs. Rudolpho (Linda) Bustamante of Stockton, CA, Mrs. James (Lois) Metheny of Lancaster, CA and Mrs. William (Lori) Sears of rural Greenville. She is also survived by 8 grandchildren, Jamie, Misti, Lindy, Willy, Daylen, Parker, Aspen & Lisa, a step grandson Kip, 11 great grandchildren, Perry, Anthony, Tommy, Hayley, Wyatt, Alexis, Marissa, Austin, James, Eli, and Isaac.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her two brothers Howard Lapp Jr. and Kenneth Lapp, a young childhood sister Lois Lapp and twin granddaughters in infancy.
