Marian Alice Cornett Coleman passed away on February 8th, 2024 at the age of 83. She is preceded in death by the love of her life Robert H. Coleman. Born in 1940, she spent many years in the Brandon and Lake Wales, Florida areas. Marian was a beloved member of the community who dedicated her life to helping children and her family.

Marian married her husband, Robert H. Coleman in 1956 at the age of 16 and had two children. They were deeply in love and their relationship was rooted in their Christian faith. Marian was determined to further her education and professional career, and finished high school at night at Brandon High School while raising a family. She was a member of the charter class at USF and obtained her undergraduate degree while driving back and forth on rural roads between Bloomingdale and Temple Terrace in the Renault the family bought to ensure a safe commute.

She became a teacher, and found joy in helping children learn. In the 1970's she went back to school to get her Master's degree in teaching as well as a reading specialist degree at USF. Marian taught school for over 40 years, and helped build the educational foundation for hundreds of students. She spent most of her career working at J.S. Robinson Elementary School in Plant City.

Marian loved singing in the church choir, and helping her community through

local organizations in leadership roles in the Order of the Eastern Star, the Alpha Delta Kappa professional teaching sorority, the DAR, and the Brandon Junior Women's Club. She was also a founding member of the Lake Wales Junior Women's Club.

Marian is survived by her daughter Debra Hernandez (Daniel) and son Bobby, as well as numerous grandchildren and great grandchildren she took an active role in helping to raise. She loved children, and nothing brought her more joy than seeing her family and students grow. Her hobbies included knitting, crocheting, all types of hand crafting, antiquing, and gardening. Marian loved genealogy and spent countless hours researching her family's ancestry. She also enjoyed hunting and fishing alongside the love of her life, her husband Bobby. Her family finds comfort in the fact that Marian and Bobby are now reunited in heaven.

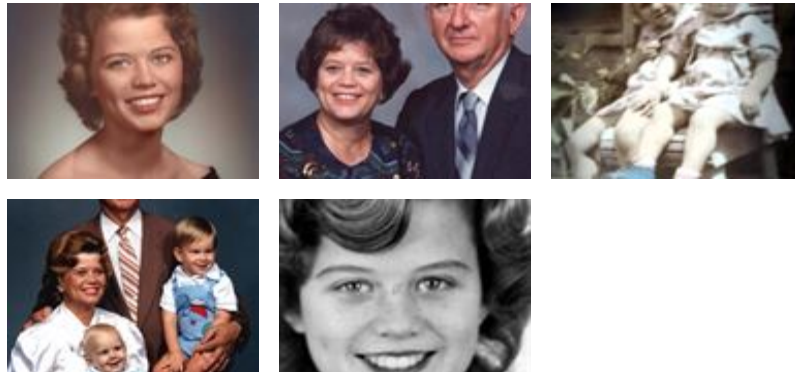
