He grew up in Mantua, Ohio, and attended Crestwood High School and later enlisted in the Army and served his country honorably in the Viet Nam war, where he was awarded the Bronze Star medal of Honor for heroic service in a combat zone. 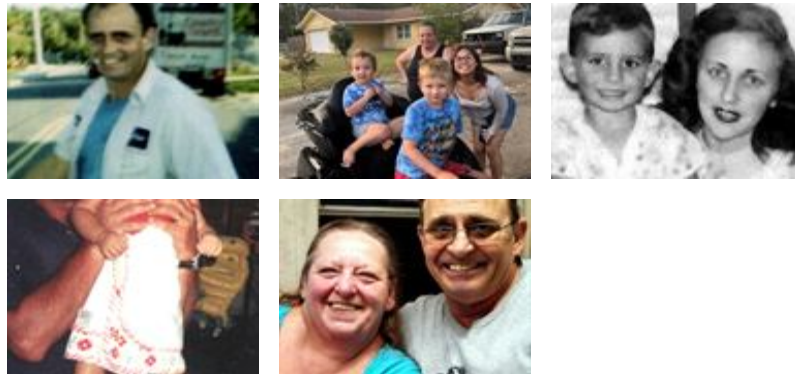

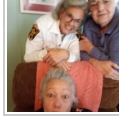
