



Mr. Robert Roy Jackson

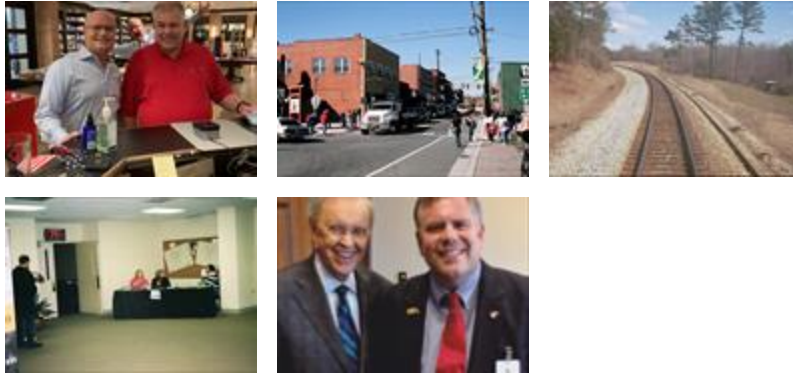
June 9, 1959 - March 10, 2020
