“ I played chess in Junior and Senior High School in Webster, NY. Got serious enough to be on the high school chess team. I even played in weekend Rochester chess tournaments. So probably Robert and I had something in common: Geekiness (yah Sharon, Robert was geeky, but you know that!). Oh wait it gets better. Around 1975 or so I got a chess set for Christmas from my parents (well ok, my mom, Dad was out drinking beer with Uncle Joe and Jimmy, you know, the Empire Wrecking crew). It was a beautiful set. It was made of Onyx. The board was made of ice blue and ice white squares of Onyx marble measuring 18x18x1. The chessmen were sculptured pieces with 4" Mayan-"Tiki" looking Kings and Queens. It had to weigh 10 pounds. It was bought in Mexico at my Mother's request to someone going on vacation there. And actually, it was bought early in the day at a Mexican tourist shop, and unfortunately the hotel was not nearby so the set had to be carried for most of the day until the return to the hotel. At the end of vacation, that set boarded a plane, traveled to the US, and was hand delivered to my mom,

That board continued to travel with me across several states and probably 30 apartments.

Around 2003 I leaned the board against the wall in my house in New Orleans. Yup. I bumped it and wow did it shatter; as depressing as it was seeing it (in slow motion) hit the tile floor, it was really cool to see the effects of the shattering pattern of the onyx. I think Robert would have liked to have seen the Physics of the shattering too, but of course with a different specimen.

But I still have most of the pieces today. I have added a photo of them tonight where I set them up on a chess board Denise's mom gave for Christmas a while back. I stuck in my "Tiki" Tac Toe boards I make nowadays.

I guess it's those little things that really have an effect on you. But
