Ruth Tuten Johnson born January 5, 1935 in Keysville, Florida, passed away in her sleep on May 23, 2025 in Plant City, Florida.

She was preceded in death by her husband of 52 years, Ervin L. Johnson; parents, Harry E. Tuten Sr. and Alberta Hunter Tuten; and sister, V. Irene Bailey Chandler.

She was born and grew up in Keysville, Florida and graduated as class valedictorian from Pinecrest High School. She and her best friend, Mae Ellen Cook got their first job at Mulberry Lumber Company. They would ride together in a borrowed car and they worked for several years until they both got married. Ruth always enjoyed working in places as a sales person in the lumber business. She loved the construction business of putting together building materials for a house, shed, or playhouse.

Ruth was the neighborhood stay-at-home mom as the other moms were working. She was the nurse, who made all the illnesses and boo-boo's better, the referee, when there was an argument, and last of all, the homework enforcer.

She loved each person that crossed her path. She was a cancer survivor and depended on the lord to provide. She accepted Jesus as her savior as a

young girl and was a member of many local Baptist churches. In the late 1960's, Ervin and Ruth were called to open their home as a mission church from Turkey Creek Baptist Church in the Durant-Pleasant Grove area. Pleasant Grove Baptist Church constituted into a standalone church in 1974. The church changed their name to Durant Baptist Church and is still shining a light in the community. Ruth has been a member of Brandon First Baptist for over forty years and has made many friends.

She is survived by children, Connie Webb (Roger), and Greg Johnson; grandchildren, Tyler Webb, and Ashley Webb; brother, Eddie Tuten (Doris); uncle, Hubert Hunter; brother-in-law, Jimmie Johnson (Barbara); sister-in-laws, Barbara Cobb, Pat Johnson, Edna Johnson, and Teresa Johnson; along with many other nieces, nephews, family, and friends.
