“*REV. TERRY M. DUNCAN HOMEGOING: I learnt on Thursday, in the middle of World Gospel Mission Board meeting, in Marion, Indiana that Rev. Terry M. Duncan passed on that afternoon. Terry was a very humble, dedicated, diligent, sacrificial and most loving missionary I ever knew. He served in Kenya as a missionary with WGM for 36 years, more than half of his life. He was a business manager at Kenya Highlands Bible College and many of us alumni met him there. He actually bought my first ticket to the USA in 1992. He was WGM Country Director then later Africa Regional Director. Terry was the only missionary I know of to have ever been ordained “Reverend” by AGC, under the leadership our late beloved Bishop Rev. Dr. Josep Rono. Wherever his hand touched, it was blessed. He was instrumental during the construction of Immanuel AGC sanctuary in 1990s. AGC Baby Centre in Nakuru in so many ways was his brainchild but he was always humble about it. He gave more credit to AGC than perhaps we deserve. He rejoiced with AGC in our success and he cried with us during the most difficult moments. He loved and listened to the church. He gave wise counsel and leadership to fellow missionaries and respected all, young and old. He served closely with all AGC leaders. He initiated the current growing fellowship of East Africa AGC leaders and he supported AGC Missions dearly. The last time we met was three years ago, when he and mama Karen graciously picked me from the airport to go and sign an MOU between AGC and Asbury Theological Seminary in Orlando, Florida. His last conversation with Wycliff and Staci Keter, two weeks ago, was to begin supporting Turkana Mission Field, under our new initiative of Adopt A Mission Field. To Karen Duncan, Robby, Brent, Teresa, Tiana and all of your families, AGC loves you and prays for extraordinary grace sufficient for moments like these.
